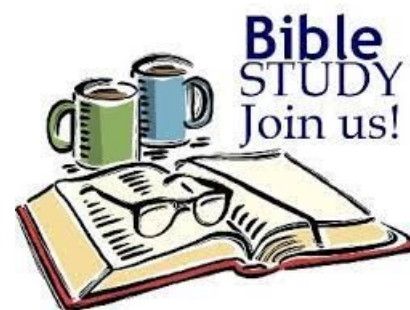

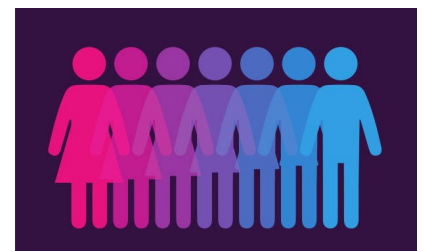
Introduction to Gender Expression and Identity in Today's World

We are honored to have as our speaker, Dr. Rebecca Boswell, PhD.

Dr. Boswell is the Supervising Psychologist at the Princeton Center for Eating Disorders (PCED), Penn Medicine Princeton Medical Center. Dr. Boswell is appointed as Visiting Research Faculty at Princeton University. In her current role, she is leading clinical training and research initiatives at PCED, including training in gender-affirming care for patients with eating disorders.

Dr. Boswell will be covering basics for us such as: what is "Gender Expression," why pronouns matter, what being transgender or non-binary looks like, what it means to be an "ally" and the importance of community support in protecting against mental health problems.

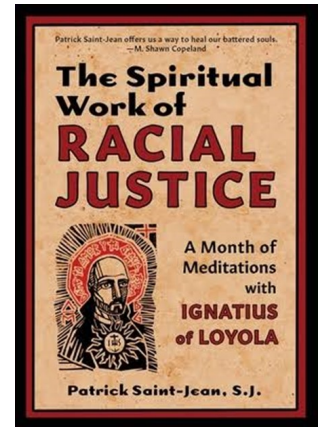
Rev. Pat Weikart will facilitate this group using **Patrick Saint-Jean's** text, "**The Spiritual Work of Racial Justice**" as a guide.
