## Loving Lent

*Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.*

The First Epistle of John 4:7-12

As this time of year rolls around, it has been fairly common for me to get this question from church members: why do we observe Lent? Isn't that a Catholic thing? My answer is always: yes and no. Yes, the Lenten practice of increased fasting, prayer and charity is an important part of the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox approach to our shared faith. No, it's not just for those parts of the Church; the Lenten journey, when done right, can be a spiritual benefit to all Christians, including Presbyterians!

The deeper question is: what is the goal of Lent? The simplest answer is to go back to the top of the page and read the passage from First John again.

Lent is about deepening our life in Christ. Deepening our life in Christ is always about love. Love, as Andy Hunter has well-said, is always about acting in the interest of the other. Period. While we Reformed Christians have traditionally eschewed having special seasons of living the Christian life in a more focused manner, I'm of the opinion that having a few weeks to renew our commitment to Christ can bear fruit for the rest of the year. Its like when I miss my morning prayer time, that negatively impacts my day, but when I keep to that schedule of quiet prayer, the fruits are born throughout that given day.

Twenty years ago, the billionaire and philanthropist, Warren Buffet was speaking to a group of students at the University of Nebraska. In answering a question about what were some of the life-lessons Buffet had gained in his nearly 90 years of life, he replied, in part: At my age, you will measure your life . . . by how many people really love you. You know, you *can't* buy love; it doesn't work. You can buy sex. You can buy testimonial dinners. You can buy your name on buildings . . . but the only way you get love is to be lovable. It's kind of irritating, actually! If you've got a lot of money, it'd be more fun to write out a check for a million dollars so everybody you know from now on loves me—but it doesn't work that way."

Mr. Buffet is right: the only way to receive love is to be lovable. Lent is an opportunity to become more lovable. Lent is a time where you can decide you're going to make that time for morning (or nighttime) prayer. Lent is offered to us so we might give a bit more sustained attention to the presence of Jesus Christ in our lives. Lent is about being more receptive to the Love of God, and that can only make us more lovable. To find our hearts carrying more of the Love of God means that there will be more love to share with others. If you think Lent is all about giving up chocolate and having to pray longer prayers, you have missed the mark entirely. Lent is about living the Christian life. The Christian life is about walking more closely with Christ. Walking more closely with Christ through prayer, Bible reading and service to others. Lent and the Christian life and attentively walking with Christ is about being more consciously receptive to God's love for you. In the end, becoming lovable is what matters in Lent.

Pray for me, that Lent will have that impact on my life. I promise, that's exactly what I'll be asking of the Lord for you, so while we are part of this loving Lent, we'll have good reason to also be... Hoping Big, Gregory

**March 6:** Our school age children will make cards to send to those members that are unable to attend worship in person.

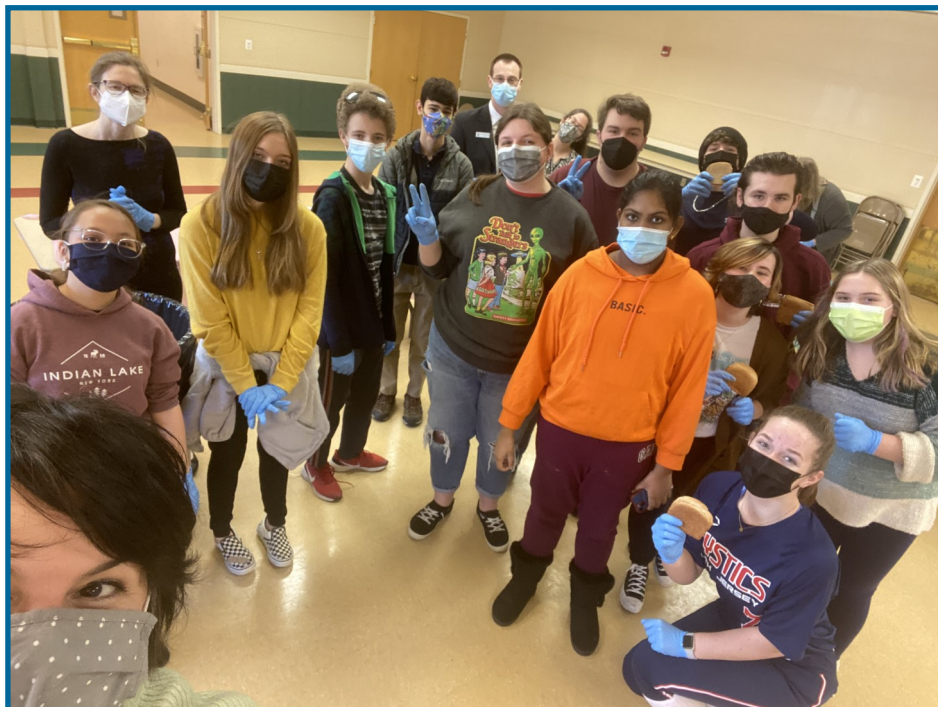

## MISSION UPDATE

### **Cathedral Kitchen, the Cherry Hill Food Pantry and Mission Thursday**

*Trinity's Mission Statement states that "Through Trinity's Mission and Outreach, we actively seek to ensure all people's basic necessities are met: physical, spiritual and civil – through engaging with the community in which we worship and beyond, with our time, gifts and voices"*

Through our support of both the Cherry Hill Food Pantry and the Cathedral Kitchen our congregation has provided support to individuals and families in our community that face the daily challenge of simply not having enough food to eat.



**Cathedral Kitchen** – During 2021 we donated well over 10,000 sandwiches, almost 6000 bottles of water, over 500 bags of fruit and over 250 bags/boxes of snacks to CK. This includes sandwiches donated through Mission Thursday and sandwiches made by the youth of our church during Sunday School and Mixers and Mission. Since the start of the pandemic, we have donated 23,798 sandwiches and counting! Enough for almost 12,000 meals!

Cathedral Kitchen is extremely excited to be reopening their dining room on March 1<sup>st</sup> for in-person dining. Our plan is to allow a couple of months for CK to refine their operation and see where COVID sorts out before organizing any opportunities for our congregation to volunteer at Cathedral Kitchen.

**Cherry Hill Food Pantry** – During 2021, we donated over 7,000 pounds of food and supplies to the CHFP. This includes the donations made through the Deacon's Summer and Winter Sharing. In addition, 32 members of our congregation volunteered to work one or more days at the Food Pantry.



**Mission Thursday** – Mission Thursday continued to be a tremendous success. In addition to collecting food for CK and the CHFP, Mission Thursday supported mission activities by both the Deacons and Presbyterian Women including Mothers Matter, SistaTalkPHL Diaper Mission, Military Families, R&M Boarding Home, Deacon's school supply and coat drives and the Christmas toy drive. We plan to continue Mission Thursday as long as it continues to be an effective way to support Trinity's Mission & Outreach.

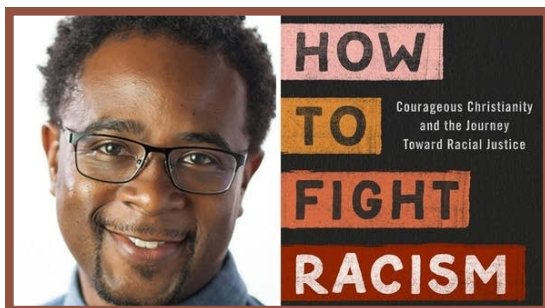
