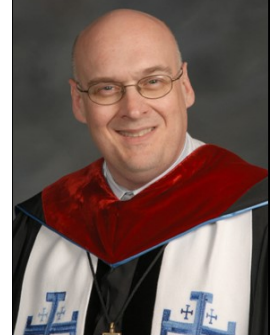

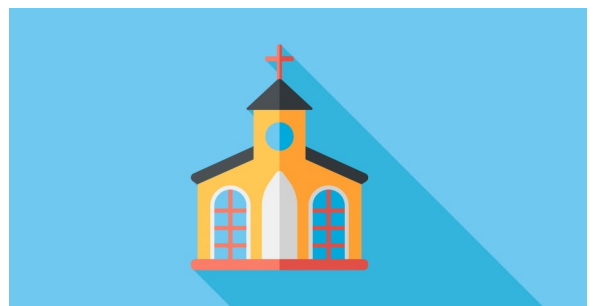


## Children's Ministries

- White-out

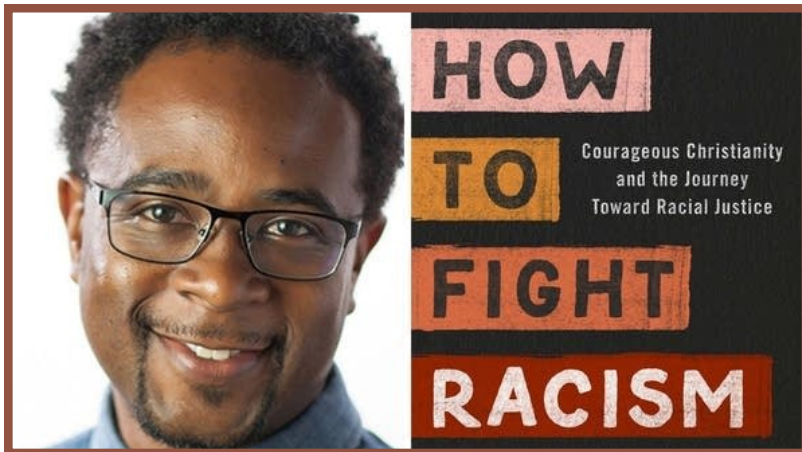
The bolded items are the ones for which we have the greatest need, because they are used so much! On the other hand, **we request that our donors do NOT provide the following** (as we have more than enough):

# **HOW TO FIGHT RACISM:** A ONE CHURCH/ONE BOOK Study Project *at Trinity Presbyterian Church*



Join our ONE CHURCH ONE BOOK study project for the 2021-2022 program year by reading Jemar Tisby's book **How to Fight Racism.** We are also offering two ZOOM opportunities each month for small group discussion and response planning to this compelling text. We will read one or two chapters each month according to the schedule presented below.

You have your choice of participating in a monthly small group discussion on each assigned reading EITHER on a Wednesday morning OR a Thursday evening, depending upon your schedule. During the small group time we will exchange our reactions to the text, engage in some additional activities to further explore the topics raised and prayerfully consider some potential responses to the challenges Tisby presents. After all, the book is entitled How to FIGHT Racism; we hope Tisby inspires us to some life-giving individual and church-wide responses to this systemic issue.

Begin this journey by picking up a copy of Tisby's book on the tables outside the church office. The book is available free of charge so that no one faces any barrier to participating in this program. If, however, you are able to purchase your book, a donation of \$15 will be gratefully accepted. When you pick up your book, please remember to note your name and email address on the sign-up sheet provided so that we can send you the ZOOM links for the small group meetings.

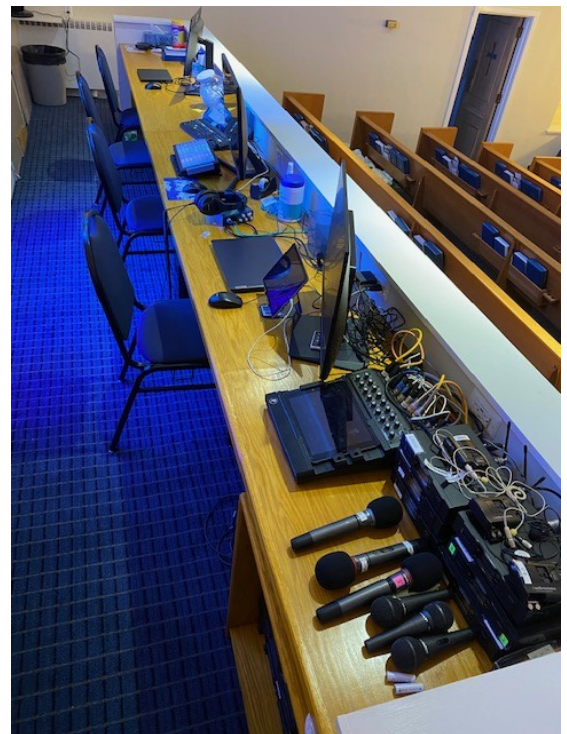

## COVID, WORSHIP, AND THE TRINITY PRODUCTION TEAM (TPT) – a Match made in Lockdown!

When the Lockdown went into effect on March 13, 2020, the Trinity pastoral staff began scrambling for a way to provide a virtual worship experience for our members and friends. Greg, Sarah, Barry, Lisa, and Brian turned to **Alene and Burt Bowen, and Susan Bastnagel**. Together, they had skills in technology, filming, and editing, and they stepped up to the plate and hit it out of the park for all of us who were floundering at home, desperately needing the connection to our fellow Trinity members and pastors. Alene is now Chair of the Production Team Committee of Session. She and Burt and Susan did the bulk of the work, starting that first Sunday in March (the 15<sup>th</sup>) when Lockdown began. Burt and Alene figured out how to do the initial recordings, and Susan joined in and edited those recordings into a coherent worship service. That first week, Burt and Susan worked on uploading the worship service to YouTube until after 2:06am! *(continued on next page)*



Thanks to them, Trinity's members were never without an opportunity to worship. How blessed we've been!

Over the course of the 15 months of Lockdown, the job evolved, and more help was needed. Alene recruited others to join the **Trinity Production Team (the TPT)** and she and Burt trained everyone to use the camera keyboard and text computer (called Open LP and Xkeys keyboard)—the tools needed to live stream our worship service to our YouTube channel. In alphabetical order they are **Joe Azevedo, Pam Dougherty, Jenny Leitinger, Mike McBride, Georgeanne Moore, Andrew Nieradka and Ben Rieth.**

**Doug Nork and Joe Azevedo** were also handling the Sound desk when Lockdown began, and it soon became apparent that the Sound desk should be moved to the balcony along with the rest of the production equipment. Joe devoted a minimum of 100 hours for sound and cameras alone, plus more time helping to move the wiring to the balcony. When the Production Team got up and running in the fall of 2020 in preparation for live streaming, Burt and Alene spent many hours training all of us to run the cameras and the text computer. Burt **wrote** the computer program that allows us to input and display the prayers, scripture and hymns that appear on our screens. **Lisa Marcelli** now obtains licensing for all the music that is performed during our services, and she types the words to all hymns and sends them to **Sue Nork**, who inputs the text into the computer program that the TPT uses to build the text portions of the service on Sunday mornings.

Burt also ran miles and miles of cable and wire to the balcony with the help of **Joe Azevedo** and **Walt Steinle**. Walt spent many solo hours on the project, having been involved in both the construction and the wiring. In the beginning, **Paul Paulson** (Kristi's husband) was also helping run wires and trouble-shooting glitches before he landed a full-time job with another church. **Clay Payne** (Sarah's husband) built 2 different tables for us to house the equipment. **Rick Fletcher** and the P&B Committee (**Walt Steinle, Dave Large, Jay Reinert and Rich Fletcher**—who isn't an official member of P&B, but is related to the Chair, LOL!) designed and built the permanent home of the TPT at the top of the balcony. **Brad Ritchie** routed the trim piece that frames the production desk. Finally, **Greg, Sarah, Barry, Lisa, and Brian** spent many hours planning and recording those services. **Melanie Faulkner** helped with candle lighting each week and communion set-up whenever it was celebrated.

**Burt** has spent innumerable hours researching different technologies, reading manuals and programming keys; meeting with the Ad Hoc Committee on streaming (**Sarah Payne, Steve Talbott and Susan Bastnagel**); attending Presbytery meetings on streaming technology—even reaching out to his high school friend, Peter Wiley, who is a minister for the United Church of Christ in Hudson, Ohio (he and his staff were very helpful); figuring out YouTube Studio; even acting like a silly lawyer trying to figure out copyright laws for music. Burt, Alene, and Susan regularly experienced a pattern of *start/stop/go in a different direction*, because what they implemented didn't work. All of it was an iterative process (meaning they had to keep doing it again and again, in hopes of improving it). There is simply too much to document.

When **Burt** was asked to quantify his hours spent on the project, he said: “If we go back to March 15th last year, I estimate I have spent **a minimum of 1,200 hours** taping, editing, researching, programming, moving equipment, pulling wires, installing, testing, training, coordinating desk and command center stuff, and talking about church streaming. I’ve been in places in the church nobody wants to see! And we’ve spent countless late nights at church...twenty of them were after 1:00am!”

**Susan Bastnagel** didn’t keep track of her hours and she’s very humble about her contribution, saying, “every single thing that makes Trinity’s livestream so outstanding comes from Burt and Alene conceiving it, and Burt figuring out how to make it happen.” But Burt reminds us that “Susan edited almost **every** video from March 15th until we began live streaming in November. She was instrumental in delivering a quality product!”

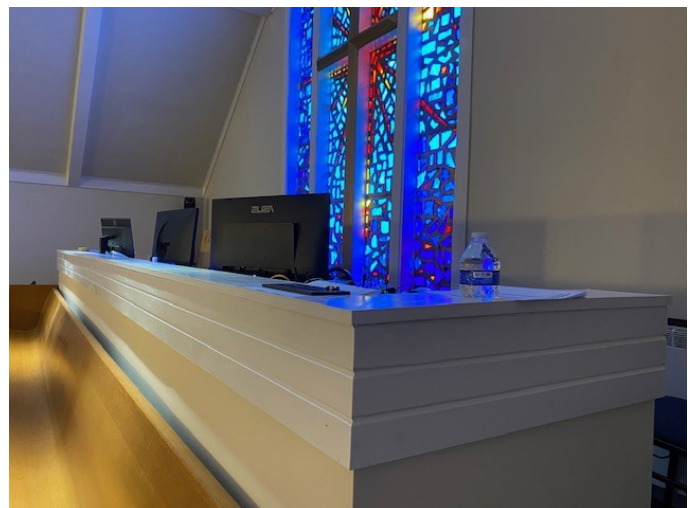
**Alene** added: “I wish I kept track of the hours I put in. During the first year, it was a lot of planning, research, meetings with Susan and Greg, endless discussions about the best way to do things, trial and error, prayers and even some tears. Covid made things even more frustrating and difficult due to lockdowns and safety concerns. Also, we formed a new Session committee and sought Session approval for funding. Recruiting and training the TPT members has been a very rewarding process—I am so very grateful to have become closer to my Trinity brothers and sisters, made new friends and of course acquired a lot of new skills. The team members are constantly teaching me about what it means to have open hearts and willing hands. They are simply the best! I guess if I had to put a number on it, eleventy billion!!”

Eleventy billion hours may not be a real number, but it helps us understand how truly monumental the task was, and it’s still not 100% finished. Burt plans to fine-tune some of the wiring at the production desk, then P&B will complete the interior drywall and the desk will be officially DONE sometime in October.

Friends, please remember that worship doesn’t happen magically; it’s carefully planned. Greg & Sarah & Barry choose the scriptures, write the sermons, choose the hymns, and design the service. Lisa and Brian research, choose and practice the music—which they perform themselves (most of the time), recruiting others whenever possible. Sue produces the 2 Orders of Service and inputs the text. And the TPT is on site every week, running the equipment that live streams our worship to your home.

The expertise of these teams kept us connected during Lockdown and will continue to keep us connected for the foreseeable future. Each week, they show us the true meaning of stewardship of time and talent.
