

## Stewardship Talk: Week 1 Presented by Coz Diegno on 10/20/2019

Good morning. My name is Cosmo Digneo and I currently serve as an Elder on the Finance & Stewardship Committee. Part of what that Committee oversees is the annual Stewardship campaign. Today is the start of this year's Stewardship campaign and the theme for this year is "Great is Thy faithfulness", meaning our faith in God and trusting that He is leading us in the best path for us. I was first called to be a Deacon about 10 years ago, and at that time my relationship with God was not on the best of terms, for various reasons. I received my call from my dear friend Doug Nork, and my initial reaction to Doug's call was...and I've learned that my reaction was similar to many as I've served on the Nominating Committee a few times and have made those calls myself...was to say, "really Doug? Me?" We had a very nice conversation and hung up. I started to think about it and found myself starting to pray about it, which I found odd for me at that time, but it was an eye opener. In the end, I said to myself that this was happening for a reason. Why, I did not know at that time, but I decided to have faith in God and to say yes. And I can clearly say that it changed my life. Since then, I have served as a Deacon twice, have gone on mission trips, now serve as an Elder, and have been part of many committees where the future of Trinity was discussed and prayed about. During all of those times, I placed faith in God. I haven't always understood, or necessarily agreed with, the path that God has shown me in my life. But, I always gave myself to having faith that he was leading me in the correct direction for me at that time. As we go through our own personal thought process during this year's Stewardship campaign, know that God has a direction for us, both individually and as a Church. Trust it and go in the direction that He leads you personally and as a family.

That being said, I now say what I have to officially say as part of the Finance & Stewardship Committee. Your pledge cards will be mailed to you over the next couple of weeks. Stewardship Sunday is on November 17, and we ask that you prayerfully consider your pledge and to bring your completed pledge cards on that Sunday. They will be collected that day, and our budget process will begin. There are a lot of great things going on at Trinity, and there are many challenges. Know that God has a path for us, whether we know it or understand it, but He has our best interests in mind.

And if you happen to receive a call from someone on the Nominating Committee, remember one thing...GOD WANTS YOU! Thank you.



This is a true story of two incredible men: Albert Lewis and Henry Covington




Albert Lewis was the author's Rabbi when Mr. Albom was a child, and is now an older man approaching the author asking, "Would you do my eulogy?" They have not really been around each other in 20 years, so the author wants to catch up on his life, so he can in fact do his eulogy in a manner fitting one who has done eulogies for many years. So, the story of "the Rev." unfolds in all the many experiences and lives of a true man of God.

Henry Covington came from a hardscrabble life into a harder life. He grew up poor, got into crime and wound up in prison. He had been in touch with God sparingly in his life, but one night he and his wife hit bottom. They were afraid of the police and rival drug lords, so they got rid of all the drugs and went back to church and read the Bible nightly. Henry became more and more active in his church, and eventually formed his own ministry: "My Brother's Keeper Ministry," which is in Detroit's poorer neighborhood.

This is a book about faith, written in hopes that all faiths can find something universal in these very different true life stories.






