Heart Speaks to Heart

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up . . . and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. Mark 1:35

It was past my bedtime and I wasn't very interested in sleeping, but I was finally in my pajamas and reluctantly getting in bed when I heard a sound I didn't quite recognize. It was my mother's voice, of that it was fairly sure, yet it didn't quite sound like her voice. I pulled back the covers, got out of bed and walked out of my bedroom. Down the hall I could hear the sound more clearly; it *was* my mother, but her voice sounded strange to me. I walked down the hall, following her voice and pushing open the bedroom door, I found her.


At the end of a long day of work followed by the evening responsibilities of being a mother and wife in the 1960's, my exhausted mother was coming to the end of her day. As I crept around the opening door, my mother's voice was muffled by her hands clasped in front of her face as she knelt by the bed; her voice, full of emotion, was calling out. Not calling out to me. Calling out to the One in whom she trusted most deeply. Though I was too young to understand it, I now realize that I had entered into a holy space. There was something going on in that conversation that was greater than what met the human eye. My mother was praying.

Over the years I saw her talking with God was not so much a great mystery as it was a friendship where she opened her heart to Jesus and tried to also listen for what the Holy Spirit might be saying in return. This past Christmas we were able to be with my 91-year-old mother for a couple days. Though her memory has been diminished by the years, she told me on more than one occasion, "I pray for you, son." I have no doubts that she does pray for me and everyone she loves because the conversation that has been the longest in my mother's life is the one that she's had with God.

During this Lenten season I'm trying to follow my mother's example and learn more about that holy conversation that is as simple as heart speaking to heart. To help you and me in the discipline of prayer, we will have our next Prayer Vigil at the end of this month--from noon on Friday, March 27 through noon on Saturday, March 28. If you have never participated in the Prayer Vigil, I earnestly encourage you to come spend an hour of quiet prayer with the Lord. As I saw in my mother's life, the conversation with Christ changes us for good.

During this Lent, may you and I grow in our friendship with the God revealed in Jesus Christ made known by the Holy Spirit! If we will all give a bit of attention to that this Lent, we will have great reason to be...



Cancer Concerns

Cancer is a disease that has stricken many at Trinity, maybe even you. Whether you have been newly diagnosed or have been a survivor of weeks, months or even years, you are likely to have thoughts or concerns that you would like to share with someone who “has been there.”

That idea was the driving force behind the formation of *Cancer and Conversation*, a group at Trinity that was established to lend support to those in our congregation who have had the disease and, if needed, provide meals and transportation. Our vision has now grown to include forums with speakers to educate the congregation about current cancer treatments and medicines and to inform us about trends in prevention and recuperation.

The 23 members of *Cancer and Conversation* would like you to know that we are here to help and support you. Whether you would like to ask a question about our treatment or follow-up, or just discuss other concerns, we are here to listen.

Our members have had many types of cancers, leukemia, testicular, breast, ovarian, uterine, endometrial, lung, cervical, kidney, prostate and pancreatic. Treatments have included surgery (both manual and robotic), bone marrow transplant, Tamoxifen, Herceptin, Arimidex, radiation and chemotherapy.

If you would like to speak to someone in the group, please call the church office and they will give you contact information appropriate to your type of cancer or treatment. As a group, we also welcome you to join us and help us expand our mission at Trinity and beyond. Check the *Work and Worship* or the Church calendar for our next meeting.

Mission and Outreach

Mission Opportunity--Homeless Hospitality Network

What is it? From November to May, 8 to 12 homeless men are housed in participating congregations for two week periods. They are provided with warm meals, a safe place to sleep and caring fellowship and support. The men attend counseling classes on money management, job, interpersonal and basic computer skills as well as drug and alcohol support groups.



When will Trinity host? Sunday April 19 -- Sunday May 3

Where is it? We share this mission program with St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Cherry Hill. The men will be housed at St. Andrew's for the two weeks. Trinity will supply overnight support both weeks and is responsible for meal and social hosting the **second week, 4/26 – 5/3**.

Who can help? Everyone.

How can you help? There are a variety of ways to serve in the program this year:

- Serve as an over-night host (one male member from each church)
- Serve as a social host--watch a game, shoot the breeze, play some cards with or just listen
- Serve a home cooked meal
- Drive the men to AA or NA meetings (evenings)
- Drive the men on Saturday to do their laundry
- Organize a Social Event (Movie, Bowling, Shopping, Sport)

Trinity has a long-standing relationship with IHOC and the *Homeless Hospitality Program*. For many years, members of Trinity have generously given their time and talents to this program. Your love and support can help rebuild lives. We ask that you prayerfully consider helping this year.

RENOVATION REDUX

The Chunk Glass Windows

The chunk glass windows were not on our original task list but, upon close examination after the sanctuary was emptied, we realized that they had to be addressed. The windows are composed of chunks of colored glass set in mortar that was then painted gold. Fifty years of exposure to the elements resulted in condensation on the interior. Combine that with 50 years of dust, and the gold mortar was stained until it was almost completely black. We made several attempts to scrub away the black stains with a variety of cleaning products, but nothing really worked. We were able to chip away at some of the goo, but 99% of the black remained. After consulting with the paint department experts at Atlas Paint in Cherry Hill, we developed a plan.

We scrubbed what we could and, although the water in our buckets turned black, the mortar showed no real signs of improvement. After the mortar dried, we applied two coats of white primer to the blackened mortar. When the primer was dry, we applied new gold paint.

The gold paint presented a bit of a challenge. It was a metallic paint that was extremely thin and required frequent stirring. Several coats were required before the primer was adequately covered. We poured the paint into plastic punch cups, then used small brushes and sponges (1/2" or less in width) to apply the paint. About a dozen different people worked on this part of the project, and each person developed his or her own best method of application. It took about 65 hours over three weeks to finish the 8 windows on the east wall of the sanctuary and the windows on the cross wall. Many thanks to Walt Steinle and Bill Stockwell who took on the highest portions of the chunk glass on the cross wall. The end result is a stunning transformation that returned the windows to their original glory.

Unfortunately, a few weeks after the windows were finished, we discovered that they still leaked and new stains were developing. We researched several methods for sealing them on the exterior of the building. Walt applied a spray-on sealant that we pray will protect our hard work for many years to come. Please take note of the gorgeous designs that illustrate the symbols of our faith. If you'd like more information on those symbols, check out the brochure called "Symbols of our Faith" in the brochure racks throughout the building.


Our hours are Tuesdays, Thursdays, and the "first Saturday" ..March 7 from 10 am to 1pm.

Library Corner

To commemorate Women's Celebration Sunday at Trinity, our library has two new novels with Christian themes by female writers:



Lila

By Marilynne Robinson

Lila—"I just been wondering lately why things happen the way they do."

Reverend Ames—"Then I'm glad you have some time to spare. I've been wondering about that more or less my

whole life."

This brief conversation between the two main characters sums up the themes of the novel. Can we

ever forget heart aches of the past? How do they affect our present lives? What constitutes moments of grace? Ultimately, the message is that loss and loneliness do not rule out solace in our lives.

Lila, a young women with a brutal past, wonders into a church in rural Iowa in the 1950s to escape a rain shower. There she meets the minister, Reverend Ames, a much older man who tragically lost his wife and child years before. The romance and marriage that follows catches husband and wife by surprise—both of them are stunned that they could love each other, that life still holds possible happiness for them.

The novel weaves together two narrative threads: the present arc of courtship, marriage and pregnancy, and Lila's past life of hardship and despair. "Part of the beauty of their bond is a mutual willingness to honor the integrity of their former lives. He prays for the 'damned' souls of her past and she begins to tend the grave of his late wife, clearing weeds and pruning the roses."

Lila is the third book in a series about the Iowa town of Gilead and two ministers who are theological sparring partners. The first book, *Gilead*, which won the Pulitzer Prize, and the second, *Home*, are both available in the Trinity library. Readers do not need to have read the other books to understand and be caught up in the story of *Lila*.

Somewhere Safe with Somebody Good


By Jan Karon
