To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven- Ecclesiastes 3:1 (King James Version)


The rock band, The Byrds, made King Solomon's words an international bestselling song when "Turn! Turn! Turn!" went to the top of the charts in 1965. 

Trinity Youth

In the freakish way summer has of making time pass it turns out it was actually three weeks ago that I-along with the rest of the Trinity Senior Highs-returned with the West Jersey Presbytery from Triennium. I have a stereotypical summer job that is both boring and requiring far too much of my college oriented attention. So before the trip Triennium seemed like a great chance to be free of work and get back in touch with my faith before I left for college; it turned into more of a “let’s hit Sarah with a truck of the Holy Spirit so she can confront all of her issues with herself and her faith in 100 degree heat,” (I’m about 99% sure that was God’s thought process when he was planning out this week for myself and the Senior Highs).



Starting things off this year we were riding on the bus with other members of the presbytery instead of our classic white vans; and being the stickler for tradition, I was none too happy about the situation. My initial commitment to remaining within my Trinity bubble was quickly burst surprisingly by myself; the rest of my Triennium experience can be pretty well summed up by this bus ride. I would have one plan then God would nudge me in another direction. The theme for Triennium this year was GO (GO and See, GO and Do Like Wise, Teach me the way I should GO, and Let my People GO), a theme I found fitting on a cosmic level given that I was going away to college to begin a whole new life and experience the world as I haven’t gotten to before. So I started talking to some of the other kids and youth leaders on the bus and they turned out to be my rocks throughout the week. This year instead of having six small group meetings like normal we had Delegation meetings which only strengthened my bond with the other members of our presbytery.

There’s one big thing you have to understand about Triennium; it’s this big monstrous beast that somehow feels like its own tiny world. This fact produces one of two results in people: you can try to be someone else, or you can just be unapologetically yourself. I’ve spent a lot of the past few years getting told that bits and pieces of me were “too much” but this week almost before I realized it I was doing myself to the fullest extent and it was amazing. In one of the sermons the pastor was carrying a backpack the whole time and she said “no one can truly understand you except God. He knows every tear you cry and why you cry it. He knows what makes you angry and what makes you ashamed...and he’s calling out to you ‘don’t shut me out’”. At the end of the sermon the pastor put down the backpack that she was carrying which was supposed to represent her sin and told us about how unnecessary it was that we carry it around. That was the big thing that hit me, I didn’t need to try and control the parts of me that other people didn’t like because God created those things and he loved them, so to hide them would be to shut him out. Ever since then I’ve worked harder to keep God in my life and as a result I’ve found myself not just loving myself more but loving other people more. A big part of our Delegation meetings was that as we went through our day we had to keep an eye out for what we called “God Moments” (meaning you saw God in someone else or you felt his presence in you or around you), and if you had one you shared it. I’ve realized it’s a lot easier to see God in the world and to feel his presence in you if you just let him in.

Triennium ended three weeks ago, in most cases by now the “Jesus Camp High” has worn off and you’re back to your normal life. But the words of the preachers, the sense of community, and the love of God have still not left me. I’m GOing to college (pun intended) in 15 days and my fear about leaving has disappeared; God is with me, my brothers and sisters in Christ are with me, and we are going into the world as the disciples in Christ to spread his love and to make change.— Sarah Gagarin

Save the Date: Adult Education programs resume Sunday, September 25!









Library Corner

The Invention of Wings

By Sue Monk Kidd

Author Sue Monk Kidd's first novel was the best-selling *The Secret Life of Bees* (also available in our library). Her most recent book, *The Invention of Wings*, has also received high praise and was an Oprah's Book Club selection.



The main character in the story is based on a real-life person—the abolitionist and suffragette Sarah Grimke, who grew up in Charleston, South Carolina in the early 19th century and, later in life, went on to become an anti-slavery spokesperson in the North. Her outspokenness about slavery's evil, based on her own observance, influenced Harriet Beecher Stowe to write *Uncle Tom's Cabin*.

The real Sarah Grimke suffered ridicule, ostracism and loneliness, all of which are portrayed in the novel. The author describes the book as “not a thinly fictionalized account of Sarah Grimke's history, but a

thickly imagined story inspired by her life.”The narrative begins on Sarah's eleventh birthday in 1803 when she is given a ten-year-old slave girl, Hetty, as her handmaid. The two girls develop a complex bond, and Sarah breaks one of the steadfast rules of the southern slave system by secretly teaching Hetty to read. This leads to harsh punishment for Hetty and this, and other actions like it, eventually lead to Sarah's own exile, under threat of death, from her hometown.

By alternating chapters between the first-person perspectives of Sarah and Hetty, Sue Monk Kidd brings the characters to life and shows how the two are actually similar. Both are confined by the world in which they find themselves—Sarah as a woman and Hetty as a slave. The title, *The Invention of Wings*, is a metaphor for their individual flights to freedom. The story follows their lives for thirty-five years until they both eventually find their wings and fly to freedom.

Do you sew, knit or crochet? Would you like to use those skills in a mission project? Once again this year, *Cancer and Conversation* is sponsoring a collection of items for Cancer victims in the Delaware Valley. We hope many in our congregation will help. Needs are:

Sewers

You may remember from last year's collection that one of the items that our contact, *Mothers Matter*, collects for their Cancer Care Baskets is a cancer pillow, a small **8x10 pillow** that a breast cancer patient can use as a pad under her seat belt shoulder strap, support under her arm during chemo, under her breast or any other time that comfort is needed. Not only is this an easy and useful hands-on mission, but it may also give you sewers an idea of what to do with all the extra fabric you may have accumulated at home.

Directions for the pillows :

Cut two fabric pieces 9" by 11". Please, NO flannel or velour. *Mothers Matter* would like bright, cheerful colors *in cotton*.

With right sides together, sew a 3/8 inch seam on THREE sides. LEAVE ONE OF THE SHORT ENDS ENTIRELY OPEN.

Turn right side out, iron flat but DO NOT STUFF. The volunteers of *Mothers Matter* will put their logo tag on the open end before stuffing and sewing up.


Knitters and Crocheters

Cancer and Conversation is also hoping to provide items to local chemo facilities. Needs include hats and lap blankets.

Hats- Use a pattern of your choice. Those hats, of various colors and styles, will not only provide warmth but will also be a style statement for those women or men who lose hair while undergoing chemo.

Lap blankets- Again, this is a comfort item for chemo patients and will be made available at chemo sites for patients to take home. Our group has researched sizes and, although they vary, a standard size seems to 48"x 36", long enough to cover a seated adult.
